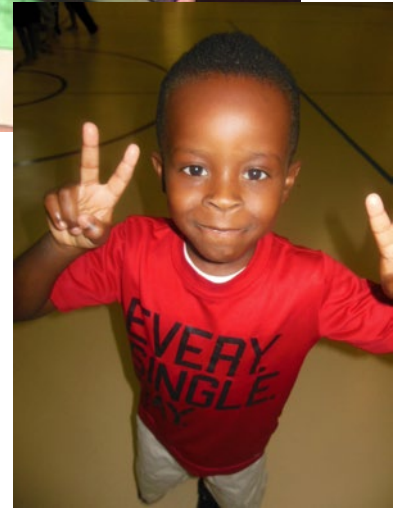
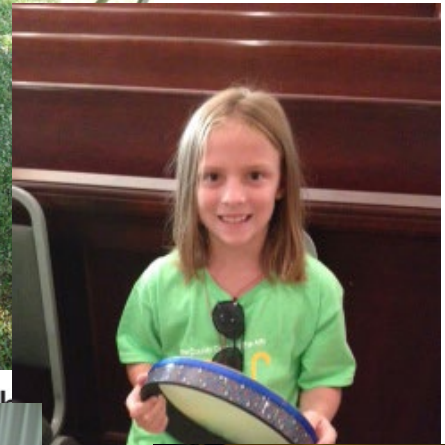

## Creative Expression and Artistry at the Hairport Salon

The Hairport, owned by Sandra Rodgers, opened as a new business in June of 1984 in a two-station hair salon on Lynwood Drive in Lancaster. The business grew and relocated to a four-station salon 1 1/2 year later. Then in 1986, Annette Spencer became a partner and the business grew even more and re-located to Catawba Street in 1992. This successful partnership is still thriving at present after 30 years and employs seven hairdressers, an esthetician, two manicurists and two salon assistants.

## Business Milestones

- Significant growth from one person to the current staff of 11.
- Provide quality service and jobs to a professional staff since inception, despite economic downturns.
- Average length of employment by The Hairport stylists is 18 years.
- Owners commitment to provide quality products and services, results in a client population from 75 in 1984 to well over 650 in 2014.
- Nominated for the "Spread The Love" award from Matrix USA.
- 50% of the stylists are graduates of the cosmetology program at the LHS Career Center.
- Selected as 2015 Small Business of the Year by the Lancaster Chamber of Commerce.

The Hairport has consistently contributed to this community and beyond in many significant ways – from the Cancer Society to the Lancaster County Council of the Arts and artist community. The Hairport maintains an LCCA business membership and is our promotions partner; salon walls serve as gallery for original art; previous membership SC Fashion and Education committee; Ladies Auxiliary at Springs Memorial Hospital (wigs for cancer patients).
