Elisabeth Streeter is one of two Visitor Coordinators at the Native American Studies Center. She previously worked in the USCL Art Studios with Professors Fran Gardner, Brittany Taylor-Driggers, and Dianne Mahaffee. Along with her work at the Center and at USCL, Streeter has worked with Mahaffee who teaches art classes both at USCL and Discovery School. Streeter has completed over 100 hours in an apprenticeship with Mahaffee in her studio along with hours in her Discovery School classroom. Streeter is a senior at USCL working on a degree through Palmetto College in Art, English, and Sociology to help her pursue a career in art education or graphic designing. From an early age, she has had an eye for aesthetically pleasing things. Streeter has stated that "I believe my passion for the Arts derives from my curiosity of other cultures, daily life, and nature. She plans to be a graphic artist and/or an Arts teacher. "My hopes are to be able to spread the values in the Arts any way that I can, be it teaching or in modern usage such as advertisement," Streeter says. "I believe that without the Arts in life, it would be more difficult for people to live as they do today because every aspect of life has some form of Art in it. Whether it is an everyday logo, or a song one hears in the grocery store, the Arts are everywhere, and should be more appreciated and respected because of how much they are involved in life." Streeter currently researches Arts development for Lancaster County which started from an Arts internship under Professor Fran Gardner and has turned into many hopeful ideas for the county. "We have so many great Arts programs here already however, I look forward to pursuing more of my own ideas in hopes a further thriving Arts community in Lancaster," Streeter says.
